Course Description

Introduction to Computers is a course that introduces basic computer tasks using Windows, typing with a word processor, navigating the web, and working with email. Major topics covered in Unit 1 include the basics of using Windows 7 and the Documents library and Word features such as AutoCorrect, Copy and Paste, and more. Major topics covered in Unit 2 include browsing the web with Internet Explorer and sending/receiving email.

- Navigate in a website via hyperlinks
- Perform a basic instant search
- Use favorites to mark and navigate to websites
- Send an email message
- Receive and reply to messages
- Open attachments; send attachments
- Describe two safeguards against Internet security threats
